Town Manager Grier and Mayor Davis stressed that the donations should be handled on a case by case basis to determine the merit of each. Council Member Binney thought it might the wrong impression that a council member might be buying votes ahead of an election if less it occurred less than six months before and therefore giving an incumbent an advantage. Council Member McDaniel also agreed on a case by case basis with no time frame. Council Members Dueker and Rappaport suggested not 3 months before an election.  A motion to accept the limitation of no donations six months before any Star Valley election was made by Council Member Dueker. No one seconded the motion and the motion failed.
9.	Discussion and possible action regarding automatic Cost of Living and Consumer Price Index increases for staff. Requested by Council Member Binney.  Town Manager Grier indicated that inflation was an issue but he felt cost of living increases

A roll call vote was taken:

Town Manager Grier indicated that inflation was an issue but he felt cost of living increases should be looked at in conjunction with all benefits ie: sick leave, vacation leave, etc. Also, it doesn't address newer employees and reflected that last year's raise was different among employees. There needs to be transparency between hourly employees and those under contract. Council Member Binney said it should not be automatic and contingent on town manager's review. Council Member Rappaport said it should be reviewed as part of the whole employee handbook. Council Member Binney was not against tabling the issue. Council Member McDaniel also agreed to table the discussion until more information was available. There was no motion and the action died.

# CLASSIFICATIONS FOR EXECUTIVE SESSION

Note: Should an executive session be convened on any item(s) listed on the regular meeting agenda, Council will review, discuss, or receive advice of Counsel, which will be considered under the

respectively approved classifications listed below:

a. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.1 — Discussion or consideration of employment, assignment, appointment, promotion, demotion, dismissal, salaries, disciplining or resignation of a public officer, appointee or employee of any public body, except that, with the exception of salary discussions, an officer, appointee or employee may demand that the discussion or consideration occur at a public meeting. The public body shall provide the officer, appointee, or employee with written notice of the executive session as is appropriate but not less than twenty-four hours for the officer, appointee, or employee to determine whether the discussion or consideration should occur at a public meeting.

b. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.2 - Discussion or consideration of records exempt by law from public inspection, including the receipt and discussion of information or testimony that is specifically

required to be maintained as confidential by state or federal law.

c. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.3 - Discussion or consultation for legal advice with the attorney or

attorneys of the public body.

d. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.4 - Discussion or consultation with the attorneys of the public body in order to consider its position and instruct its attorneys regarding the public body's position regarding contracts that are the subject of negotiations, in pending or contemplated litigation or in settlement discussions conducted in order to avoid or resolve litigation.

e. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.5 - Discussions or consultations with designated representatives of the public body in order to consider its position and instruct its representatives regarding negotiations with employee organizations regarding the salaries, salary schedules or compensation paid in the

form of fringe benefits of employees of the public body.

f. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.6 - Discussion, consultation, or consideration for international and interstate negotiations or for negotiations by a city or town, or its designated representatives, with members of a tribal council, or its designated representatives, of an Indian reservation located within or adjacent to the city or town.

g. A.R.S. § 38-431.03.A.7 - Discussions or consultations with designated representatives of the public body in order to consider its position and instruct its representatives regarding negotiations for

the purchase, sale, or lease of real property.
