Introduction

The Town of Star Valley was incorporated in 2005, making this community one of Arizona's newest towns. The town of Star Valley is located in Northern Gila County and contains 36 square miles of land within its

incorporated boundaries, whereas the community's planning area contains about 100 square miles. Currently, both public and private lands are included. Star Valley's elevation is approximately 4,650 feet and is nearly surrounded by the Tonto National Forest. The Town is located south of the Mogollon Rim and north of the Sonoran Desert, which comprises a portion of central and southern Gila County. Immediately west of the community is the incorporated Town of Payson.

The Town of Star Valley adopted the town Council\Manager form of government and has a Town Manager, Mayor, and six Councilmembers that are elected at-large. Council functions include but are not limited to reviewing and approving the annual budget, establishing long & short-term objectives and priorities, responding to constituent needs and complaints, and representing the community to other levels of government. Star Valley's 5 ½ acre community park opened its gates in 2014. The park was named in honor of Ronnie and Diane McDaniel who were instrumental in the incorporation of Star Valley. The park contains a playground, tot playground, children's zipline, fitness trail, and pickleball court. There are numerous small ramadas available and one large group area ramada. A water battle arena complete with water cannons will soon be completed as another recreational opportunity for children, and adults too!

Revenues – Where does the money come from?

The town accounts for basic functions such as public safety, parks, community development, and general administration using government resources.

The largest source of revenue for the Town of Star Valley comes from state-shared taxes, which make up about 39% of the general fund revenues for the town. The town received one-time operating grants which are 28% of the revenues for the year ending 2022. This is mainly due to the CARES Act grant.



The Town of Star Valley maintains one type of proprietary fund. Enterprise funds are used to report the same function presented as business-type activities in government-wide financial statements. The town uses enterprise funds to account for its water operations.

Each of the major revenue categories for the years 2021 & 2022 is comparable and shows recovery from the COVID pandemic. The town received one-time grant dollars in 2020, which significantly increased the grant category. These grant dollars are mainly due to the CARES Act.



Expenditures – Where does the money go?

Operating expenses are costs that are associated with the maintenance and administration of day-to-day operations. The Town of Star Valley spends about 46% of its town budget on general operating expenditures, which is the largest spending category, followed by public safety at 32%. The town holds an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with its neighboring town, the Town of Payson for its coverage of the police department.

The town's Water Department finished the year with expenditures at \$332,406. Included in these expenditures is the depreciation expense of \$80,388. Other expenditures included water system improvements such as meter and water line replacements.



The town's increase in general operating expenditures is the result of several increases in common expenditures such as auditing services, general liability insurance, and other controlling expenses. The Water Department's expenditures have increased due to improvements in the water infrastructure.



Budget Performance – How did we do this year?

This year the town's actual state shared revenues fell right in-line with the adopted budget amounts. Due to the economic downturn regarding Interest rates, interest earnings reflect a decline in comparison to the budgeted amount. Other revenues include an unexpected Prop 202 tribal grant and town park donations.



For the fiscal year 2022, the town budgeted its reserves for possible capital improvement projects to ensure budget authority.

Net Position – What is the net position?

The difference between assets plus deferred outflows of resources and liabilities plus deferred inflows of resources represents the net position, which may serve as a useful indicator of a government's financial position. The more assets that outweigh the liabilities, the stronger the financial health. In the case of Star Valley, assets exceeded liabilities by \$12,879,780 at the close of the most recent fiscal year.
